



**FIREARMS ACT 1996
Section 151(3)
APPROVAL FOR THE OPERATION OF A RANGE**

I, Kathryn Anne Bennett, a person having been appointed by the Commissioner of Police as his delegate (pursuant to Section 156 of the *Firearms Act 1996*) (the *Act*) in the exercise of the powers delegated to me, do hereby approve **Stephen Charles Evans** (firearms licence number 12002) ('the holder'), being a representative of the **SSAA Huon Combined Shooting Club Inc.** ('the club'), to operate a range situated at New Road, Franklin, Tasmania ('the range'). This approval is subject to the following conditions:-


Conditions of Approval

1. The range is approved for Category A, B and H firearms.
2. The Club is **not** to fire any central fire firearm of a calibre exceeding that of .308 Winchester.
3. The Club is approved to fire shotgun 6-9 shot and approved for the following disciplines:

• ISSF Slow Fire	Rim fire and Centre fire Pistol
• Service	Rim fire and Centre fire Pistol
• Metallic Plates	Rim fire and Centre fire Pistol
• Silhouette	Rim fire and Centre fire Pistol, Rim fire Rifle
• Rapid Fire	Rim fire and Centre fire Pistol
• IPSC/Practical Pistol	Rim fire and Centre fire Pistol, Rim fire Rifle
• IPSC 3 gun	Rim fire and Centre fire Pistol/Rifle and

4. All Range Officers and any person participating are to exercise extreme care at all times whilst shooting activities are taking place to prevent persons encroaching into the Range Danger Area or Range Proper or any aircraft entering the range danger airspace. Firing is to cease immediately until the persons or aircraft are no longer in danger.
5. Notice boards and Range Danger notices/signs, constructed in accordance with the Commissioner of Police's range specification guidelines are to be erected and maintained in good order.
6. A red flag is to be flown at the main gate flag pole between sunrise and sunset when shooting is in progress on any range.
7. When night shooting is taking place a red flashing light is to be in operation.
8. The stop butts are required to be maintained with an earthen cover.
9. A first aid kit and communication device is to be available at the range that is being used when shooting is taking place.

10. The club is to ensure that all club members and other organisations that might use the range are conversant with the conditions of this range approval, have a first aid kit and a communication device capable of contacting Emergency Services.
11. The Club will provide the Commissioner of Police with a copy of the Club Rules should that be required.
12. The Range/Club Rules are to be displayed at the range/club facilities and a copy of the rules is to be made available to the Commissioner upon request.
13. Pursuant to Section 153(b) of the Act, the range and its equipment must not be altered without the consent of the Commissioner.
14. Should any change or modification be made to the construction of the range in the complex, the Club is to advise the Commissioner of such change or modification in writing within 14 days.
15. The Club is to immediately notify the Commissioner of Police on any forest harvesting operations in the Range safety template area.
16. This approval may be cancelled in accordance with Section 154 of the Act by notice in writing served on the holder.
17. This approval is valid until 7th April, 2019 unless cancelled or withdrawn before that date.
